## INFORMATION ON THE PRODUCE:

### TOMATOES:

We had a rather difficult period at the end of the month of May. Following the very warm temperatures in the past few weeks, several fields have led their crops and thus, many producers have ended sooner. The new regions will begin in early June but it will take at least eight days from the first crop before the onset of new produce on the market. We are talking about the region of Georgia, which should begin to crop on June 1st, and South Carolina in June 05th or June 7th.

In the meantime, the supply will be a little bit complicated. A rising market is expected early this month and the more the producers will reap in new areas, the more prices should fall.



## PEPPERS

The peppers are facing the same temperature phenomenon as tomatoes, that is to say that the majority of producers have finished. Those of Georgia started on May 24th with very low volumes. The market is currently rising, but as soon as the volumes will increase, the price will fall. Because of the frequent days of rain in Quebec during the month of May, local producers have delayed their plantations. The delayed harvest expected is 15 days. By cons, if the temperature is hot and gives us a minimum of rain, they will have the opportunity to catch up.



## CUCUMBERS



In May, prices remained high because of the lack of sunshine. In June, the days lengthen and the sun's presence would contribute to improved volumes of greenhouse cucumbers. The price should be reduced.

## ONIONS

The new crop of Californian red onions began in May. The quality is excellent and the volumes are increasing day after day. We do not provide any major changes for the month of June.



## TRANSPORTATION



We are still living in the same situation regarding the transport costs, that is to say, they remain high, which automatically affects product prices. The reasons remain the same : economic crisis, gas prices and the strength of our dollar.
